SAIEE Bursary Program – Application Guidelines

Closing Date: 30 October

Introduction

The SAIEE bursaries are only for candidates that intend to or are currently studying for a degree or diploma in Electrical, Electronic or Computer Engineering at an accredited South African institution. This bursary will be awarded each year, depending on the availability of funds, for a maximum of four years of study. The student may be allowed to have another bursary supplementing the SAIEE bursary as long as this is declared in writing to the SAIEE and the combined total bursary amount must not exceed R150 000 per annum. The bursary must be used to cover either tuition, accommodation, books or living costs. This bursary will be subject to the general rules and conditions of the SAIEE Bursary Program. The number of awardees and the amount awarded per student in any year will be determined at the time of the offering.

Rules and Conditions for Applications:

1. The applicant must be a South African citizen or permanent resident. A certified copy of your ID is to accompany the application form.
2. The applicant must be accepted for undergraduate study in Electrical, Electronic or Computer Engineering at a recognized South African University or University of Technology.
3. The applicant must have achieved at least 70% for Mathematics and Physical Sciences and at least 65% for English in their Grade 12 final examinations. Where the applicant is still to complete Grade 12, the latest progress results may be submitted for provisional consideration.
4. Current university student **applicants should have an overall average of 60%** and above for all modules passed in order to be considered for this bursary.
5. Females with academic performance and financial need (based on parent's joint income) would be given preference.
6. Students must complete the relevant documentation and submit all the required information and attachments, including statement of results in order to be considered for this bursary.
7. The bursary does not have any work obligations and the SAIEE may assist the applicant in finding vacation training or experiential training.
8. The successful bursary holders would be expected to act as ambassadors for the SAIEE.
9. Students must agree to attend the interview which would be held at the SAIEE offices in Johannesburg or else must be available for a video conference.
10. Successful applicants may be allowed to hold another bursary as long as it is declared in writing and approved by the SAIEE, while the total combined amounts received by the student in any academic year must not exceed R150 000.
11. Students that hold the SAIEE Bursary would need to re-apply each year for consideration.
